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About the composer and poet

Jeremy M. Nabors is a music educator, conductor, and church musician in the Triangle region of North Carolina. A native of Birmingham, Michigan, he holds degrees from both the University of Michigan (BM in Music Education) and Michigan State University (MM Choral Conducting) where he studied with Jerry Blackstone, David Rayl, Jon Reed, and Sandra Snow.

Mr. Nabors has been a public school educator in North Carolina since 2004, first at Chapel Hill High School and now at the Durham School of the Arts. As a member of the DSA choral faculty, he co-directs a middle and high school choral program of 15 sections of choir.

In addition to his work at DSA, he is the Director of Music at Chapel in the Pines Presbyterian Church in North Chatham, North Carolina, a guest conductor and lecturer to choirs throughout North Carolina, and the Founding Artistic Director and Conductor of Vox Virorum TTBB chorus of the Triangle.

Writer and poet, Susan Ward Nabors is a native of Jackson, Mississippi. She graduated from St. Andrew's Episcopal School where she first learned to love creating and writing. A graduate of Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts, Ms. Nabors has called North Carolina home since 2007, working in various professional roles throughout the Triangle. She likes to say she "married the choir" in 2018. Since then, the Naborses have enjoyed collaborating to create choral music for the various choirs in their lives.

Performance notes

Join Me Now In Song was written for the Durham School of the Arts Middle School choirs to perform in 2022 at their March Festival of Song in Durham, North Carolina. This was the first in-person concert the choirs had been able to perform since the nationwide shutdown of the COVID-19 pandemic. Where the pandemic had separated the singers, limiting their choral experiences to online, this concert became a celebration of communal, in-person music-making. Finally, these young musicians could join their resilient voices together to create and relish in their community of music.

Each vocal part has a unique melody, which when combined, creates a tapestry of music that is impossible to duplicate alone. Several sections of the song are in unison, representing that time when we were all alone behind our computer screens, unable to make harmony with our fellow singers.
