The text of this Renaissance carol was written by Robert Croo in 1534; the song was named after the city of Coventry, England. It was performed in one of the traditional Coventry mystery plays that were based on biblical stories. (*The Pageant of the Shearmen and Tailors* depicted Herod's slaughter of the innocent boys in Bethlehem.) The words "lully, lullay" were common slang meaning, "I saw, I saw!" In the play, the mothers of Bethlehem sang this carol as a lullabye to their children.
