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About the arranger:

Allen Koepke, (b. 1939) was born and raised in Chicago, but has been an Iowan since 1956, presently residing in Cedar Rapids. A graduate of Luther College and the University of Northern Iowa, he has taught choral music from grade school through college, having retired from Kirkwood Community College in 1996 after serving the school for 16 years. He presently has over 60 published works found in six publishing houses. He has received numerous commissions including *In Praise of Music* written as the *Finale* for the 1996 Iowa All-State Music Festival in celebration of their 50th anniversary; *Missa Brevis*, written for the University of Northern Iowa and their 1995 concert in Carnegie Hall, and *A Vision, A Dream*, written for the Iowa Sesquicentennial celebration in 1996.

Koepke has received several honors, including the "1996 Iowa Professor of the Year" granted by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement and Support of Education. He was awarded "Innovator of the Year" by the National League for Innovation for his work in computerized music instruction. In 1997, he was honored by the Iowa Choral Directors Association and granted the Robert M. McGowan Memorial Award "for outstanding contribution to choral music in Iowa." During the 1997-99 seasons, Koepke was the Composer-in-Residence for the Cedar Rapids Symphony Orchestra—three of his compositions were performed by the orchestra. He has judged choral events from coast to coast during the past forty years, including evaluating over 500 show, jazz, and concert choirs in the past five years alone. His biography can be found in the official Marquis "Who's Who In America."

Koepke presently enjoys his position as Director of Choral Activities at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.
